B Results so far

The specialisation of the Bogotá region is an initiative inspired by the Smart Specialisation concept developed in the EU and has been engaging more than 140 actors and creating strategic dialogues with quadruple helix actors, public-private governance and an entrepreneurial forum. "Ruta N" is a public-private consortium in Medellín, developing a creative ecosystem based upon the areas of health and biotechnology, energy and advanced public services/ICT. As a result, cooperation agreements have been signed with Spain, France, the Netherlands and the United Kingdom and 163 international companies have been established in the territory (JRC, 2017). In 2015, the Administrative Department of Science, Technology and Innovation (Colciencias) invested more than two millions of USD (Convocatoria Especialización Regional Inteligente Colciencias - MinTIC) in ICT industry through associative initiatives in 7 Colombian regions (Colciencias, 2015).
