Key issues identified:

- 1. Lack of collaborative governance
- Lack of coordination between H2020, ESIF and national/regional authorities
- 3. The career system does not motivate researchers from public organisations to participate in H2020
- 4. PROs projects are less oriented towards marketable results, spin-off or prototype/product creation
- Low motivation for SMEs to participate in H2020 projects





Future Baltic States R&I collaboration: why?

- Shared geographical location
- Small markets
- Limited global presence
- Shared values
- Geopolitical reality
- ESIF reduction





Future Baltic States R&I collaboration: preconditions

- Knowledge "how to"
 - Success and failure cases of collaboration in macro regions
 - Particular cultural environment
- Existing networks
 - Identification of strong R&I networks (Baltic, global)
 - Other areas of good collaboration practice
- Support from EC
 - Existing support from JRC
 - Involvement of other DGs
- Resources
 - Macro regional financial instruments
 - Benefit through better resource allocation
- Political support
 - Level of Prime Ministers
 - Level of Ministry of Foreign Affairs/Embassies
 - Level of academia/business
 - Level of society in general





Future Baltic States R&I collaboration: WIIFM?

- Better allocation of resources:
 - Less support for weak projects
 - Less competition for strong projects
- Better disposition of infrastructure:
 - Coordinated approach to new Baltic research infrastructure development
 - Better employment of existing infrastructure
- Better circulation of social and financial capital:
 - Easier access to finance for innovation
 - More convenient support for researchers/research teams
- Better global appearance:
 - Stronger visibility through collaboration
 - Wider list of what to offer

- Analytical capacity building at ministerial and university level and experience exchange
- What is the next step towards collaboration with Nordic countries (Nordforsk)?
