What is Smart Specialization Strategy?

- *innovation strategy to determine most promising areas of R&D to efficiently focus investments*
- based on regional strengths to build competitive advantage
- developed through entrepreneurial discovery process: a partnership between businesses, public entities, research community and civil society/users (quadruple helix)





Why is it important?

- develop region's potential by matching research and innovation strengths to business needs
- address emerging opportunities and market developments, find competitive niches
- increase return on investments and improve R&D impact on society (better growth & more jobs)

And, last but not least:

• ex ante conditionality for the use of European Structural and Investment Funds to support R&D in 2014-2020 to be fulfilled by end of 2016 at the latest





Czech Smart Specialization Strategy

- responsible body: Office of the Government Section of Deputy Prime Minister for Science, Research and Innovation
- prepared on the national level + 14 regional annexes
- 2 types of measures:
 - horizontal (systemic) interventions
 - vertical intervention = specialization domains
- first version approved in December 2014 but the process continues
- *ex ante conditionality for 3 Czech operational programmes*



Where are we and what needs to be done?

Specialization domains

- first proposal based on SWOT and economic analysis and EDP in the regions but too broad to be considered real specialization domains → need to streamline/prioritise
- work to be done by the National Innovation Platforms
- expected outcome: proposals of streamlined domains by end of June
- need to reflect the streamlined domains in the calls of the relevant OPs





Where are we and what needs to be done?

Monitoring and budget

- establish effective monitoring mechanism (to evaluate if we are getting what we want)
- set budget for the strategy (combining EU, national, regional and private resources)
- formal approval by the Government by the end of 2016 and submission to the EC
