


Europe 2020 and Cohesion Policy are key instruments to help exit the Crisis

- CP refocused to promote smart, sustainable and inclusive growth
- Shift from a spending philosophy to an impact philosophy
- SF are key delivery mechanism for Europe 2020, to cofinance growth-enhancing investments



Those MS that have invested in R&I exit the crisis faster






Cohesion Policy funding for R&I 2007-2013

Cohesion Policy innovation support over total aid:

- □ 4% in 89'-93'
- □ 7% in 94'-99'
- □ 11% in 00'-06'
- □ 25% in 07'-13'





Smart Specialisation (RIS3) helps regions to become more innovative

- **1**. (Tough) Choices: select limited number of priorities on the basis of own strengths and international specialisation, concentrate funding and focus effort on these
- **2**. Competitive Advantage: take into account your relative position to other regions differentiate yourself others, diversify your unique, localised know-how into new combinations and innovations
- **3**. (Critical Mass) Clusters and Connectivity: develop world class clusters and provide arenas for cross-sectorial links and knowledge-spillovers internally in the region and externally with other regions
- **4.** Collaborative Leadership: engage in an open, participatory process, involve business and innovation actors from the start
