

The Motivation for a regional strategic program

- 1985/1986: Downfall of major parts of Austrian state owned industry
- Quadruplication of the regional unemployment rate from 1980 to 1987
- Strong need for regional restructuring of the industrial core
- Reorientation of the concepts and missions of public economic policy




Basic characteristics of innovative Upper Austria 2010plus

- To-down and bottom-up dynamic, which can be captured in the context of working groups
 - working groups focus on specific regional issues and are organized by regional promoters from the business sector, the public sector, the social partners and by members of the Council for Research and Technology for Upper Austria
- Continuation approach that builds on the preceding strategy concepts
 - R&D calls for a sustainable policy and not leap frogging between various areas



The governance of Innovative Upper Austria 2010plus




The process flow for identifying targeted technology fields






Main points of the chosen approach

- Focus the strategy on "Upper Austria's Double-Strongpoint-Fields"
- Bet on global Technological and Innovation <u>Leadership</u> <u>in Niches</u> rather than on (copying) Mega Trend Technologies (which are pursued by everybody on the globe with no chance at all for a comparatively small region like Upper Austria to assume global leadership)

1. Stakeholder involvement


- Mobilising the regional triple helix in Upper Austria
- Transparent selection process of participants focusing on a triple helix balance, a minimum of bias and an outward view
- Continous communication during the elaboration process AND programme period

2. Data / Analysis / Studies / Monitoring

Upper Austria takes part in the OECD-TIP Smart Specialisation Project



- Objective of the project:
 - The project initiated by OECD in cooperation with BMWF (Federal Ministry of Science and Research of Austria) runs slightly more than one year till the end of 2012 and aims to identify:
 - Good Practices in regional strategies and innovation policies,
 - Development methods for Smart Specialisation Strategies,
 - ➤ Selection criteria for the evaluation of Smart Specialisation Strategies.
