#### Background

In 2022, the Joint Research Centre and the Directorate General for International Partnerships (DG INTPA) of the European Commission joined forces launching the project Science Technology and Innovation (STI) for Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) Roadmaps in Africa.

The objectives of the STI for SDGs Roadmaps in Africa project are to contribute to the formulation of effective STI policies and strategies and to support the development of effective innovation ecosystems towards the SDGs in Africa, in line with the EU priorities for STI cooperation with Africa. As a final objective, the project aims at strengthening STI capacities and building more inclusive and sustainable societies.

The project uses the novel approach developed by the Joint Research Centre to develop operational roadmaps for future investments in research and innovation priorities. These roadmaps are based on the unique potentials and challenges of each target country and mobilise science, technology and innovation to address key societal, environmental and economic issues in line with the achievement of the SDGs.

The methodological approach stems from the experience of Smart Specialisation Strategies in the European Union and beyond and the successful adaptation of Smart Specialisation approach to the rationale of STI for SDGs roadmaps as defined by United Nation's Inter-Agency Task Team (UNIATT) in cooperation with JRC.

The duration of the project is two years. During 2022, an initial screening of the Sub-Saharan African countries has allowed to identify 14 countries that meet minimum requirements for the future development of STI for SDGs Roadmaps (i.e. political stability, existence of basic R&D data, ongoing STI policy-related initiatives, existence of Voluntary National Reviews for SDGs, and STI policy frameworks)<sup>1</sup>.

These countries' STI systems have been further analysed to map their key policy actors and institutions, national strategies, other STI organizations, STI performances and business environment, linkages between STI and SDGs.

These findings, together with the countries' expression of interest were the basis to finally identify 6 countries that will go through the whole STI for SDGs roadmap development process in the second year of

the project, throughout 2023. These countries are **The Gambia, Malawi, Mauritius, Namibia, Rwanda,** and **Seychelles**.

#### Structure of the event

The meeting is scheduled for two and half days, starting in the morning on 7 February and ending on 9 February. The first day will be entirely dedicated to the project kick-off with the presence of JRC and DG INTPA, as well as representatives of the pilot countries who will share the state of the art on STI systems, policies and frameworks towards the SDGs. Needs, expectations and next steps will be discussed both in plenaries and bilateral meetings.

The second and the third days are devoted to capacity building training workshop delivered in collaboration with invited partners, including UNDESA and AUDA-NEPAD. This session will provide knowledge and more details on the steps of STI for SDGs Roadmap development.

The event will be the occasion to hold bilateral meetings with countries' representatives on the next steps of the project.

#### **Objectives**

The meeting will have the following objectives:

- Officially launch the pilot phase with the six countries that will be part of the project
- Describe the project on STI for SDGs roadmaps in Africa and raise awareness on the activities that will be carried out, milestones and achievements
- Present the findings of the JRC research mapping the STI systems in Sub-Saharan Africa and receive feedback and comments from participants
- Gain better knowledge of the status of STI for SDGs in the countries, with a focus on gaps, needs and challenges that could potentially be addressed with the STI for SDGs roadmaps
- Define next steps to kick start the activities within each country
- Strengthen capacities on the steps for STI for SDGs roadmaps development
- Raise awareness on STI for SDGs roadmaps development in the global landscape and the DESA activities on localisation and SMEs in target countries.
