



Network of 200 European Digital Innovation Hubs



- Offer support for digital transformation which is adapted to local needs, based on a specialisation
- Build regional ecosystems of users and suppliers, strengthening local innovation environment
- Connect to the whole of Europe through the network:
 - Share best practices with other hubs
 - Connect local SMEs to SMEs outside the region, building new value chains in Europe
 - Disseminate digital capacities of Digital Europe Programme to local community

Outcomes and deliverables

- A balanced network of EDIHs
- Indicators to evaluate the performance of the hub
 Number of businesses and public sector entities, which have used the EDIH.
 Amount of additional investments successfully triggered
 Number of collaborations foreseen with other EDIHs and stakeholders outside the region at EU level, and description of infrastructures jointly shared / joint investments with other EDIH.
- A set of additional impact indicators will be collected and analysed with the support of the Digital Transformation Accelerator:
 - Increase in digital maturity of organisations that have used the services of the EDIH network. Market maturity and market creation potential of innovations, as defined in the JRC's Innovation Radar methodology.

Conclusions

- EU, Member States and/or their Regions are co-investing in the same support structures
- Digital preparedness of regions will influence the type of services a hub should offer
 => important to measure it!
- Through the Digital Decade, MS and EU will monitor progress regarding digitalisation of business
- Increase in Digital Maturity of organisations helped by hubs is essential to evaluate impact of network of EDIHs
- For the hubs there is no "one size fits all", but they can use their entrepreneurial spirit to offer the best services to their customers, while learning from others and benefitting from central support at European level
