

From theory to action: synergies = combining innovation investments under smart specialisation priorities supported by ESIF with world-class R&I initiatives supported by FP

2010: **EU2020 and Innovation Union**: commitments 24 & 25 + intro

End 2013: **H2020 and ESIF Regulations** contain references to coordination between programme and synergy-friendly rules

(Declaration on Seal of excellence 2013/C 373/02 20.12.2013

July 2014: **Joint REGIO – RTD Guide on synergies** (sequential / parallel / combined/ alternative funding)

Nov 2014: New Commissioners Moedas and Creţu - mandate from President Juncker:

Maximise synergies!

June 2015: Commissioner Moedas priorities: Seal of Excellence under Open Innovation pillar/Maximise impact

October 2015: Launch of the Seal of Excellence joint initiative by Commissioners Moedas and Creţu

June-July 2016: Council conclusions and EP resolution

June 2017: **Future of Finance reflection paper** (single set of rules for coherence and complementarities between funds) & **ERAC opinion**

July 2017: "Lamy" report & Communication on Smart Specialisation - focus on synergies


January 2018: Communication on H2020 interim evaluation

May 2018: **MFF Proposal** June 2018: **legal proposals**





Taxonomy of synergies



EU initiatives supporting synergies

- Seal of Excellence (DG RTD) quality label awarded to excellent H2020 proposals
- Policy Support Facility Mutual Learning Exercise (DG RTD)
 'Widening participation to the EU Framework Programmes & ensuring synergies between H2020 and ESIF'
- Stairway to Excellence (JRC/S3 Platform) support for synergies by stimulating early & effective RIS3 implementation
- EIT Regional Innovation Scheme strengthens capacity of regions' innovation enablers & actors, by working with local knowledge triangle research, education & business

Synergies between H2020 and ESIF – challenges (1)

Different approaches:

FP/H2020	ESIF
Excellence-based / Non-territorial approach	Socio-economic development / Place-based approach
Aims at enhancing competitiveness through direct funding for excellent research and innovation	Aims at enhancing cohesion through location-based economic, social and territorial development

However, they both share the same ultimate goal:
Smart and Sustainable Growth

Synergies between H2020 and ESIF – challenges (2)

Different rules and implementation structures:

FP/H2020	ESIF
Direct management: funding mostly awarded directly to final beneficiares	Shared management between EC, MS & regions: funding awarded by Managing Authorities located in MS/regions to final beneficiaries
Bi-annual Work Programmes	7-years Operational Programmes at MS/regional level
Mostly competitive calls addressed mainly to transnational consortia through peer-review based on excellence	Funding attributed to national/regional actors in the frame of strategic planning (calls for proposals at MS/regional level)
Exempted from state aid	State aid rules apply

Horizon Europe

is the Commission proposal for a € 100 billion research and innovation funding programme for seven years (2021-2027)



to strengthen the EU's scientific and technological bases



to boost Europe's innovation capacity, competitiveness and jobs




to deliver on citizens' priorities and sustain our socioeconomic model and values

€ 4.1 billion are proposed to be allocated for defence research, in a separate proposal for a European Defence Fund
