

S3 PLATFORM Peer Review for National RIS3

Peer discussion as a step towards Research and Innovation Strategies for Smart Specialisation (RIS₃)

Budapest (Hungary), 24th-25th June 2013

The Smart Specialisation Platform (S3 Platform) established by the European Commission in June 2011 at JRC-IPTS in Seville, is to provide professional advice to regions and member states in their design and development of RIS3. One of the main activities and tools offered by the S3 Platform is peer review workshops.

The peer-review workshops bring together regional and national authorities for mutual learning and exploration of ways in which Research and Innovation Strategies for Smart Specialisation (RIS3) can be developed. The S3 Platform aims to create an open and trusted learning environment where practical and conceptual aspects of RIS3 can be discussed and explored through challenges and experiences of individual regions. The workshops have two main objectives. The first objective is to allow regions and national authorities meet their peers, the European Commission staff, academic experts and others to discuss common issues related to Smart Specialisation. The second objective is to allow the participants to peer-review each other's work on RIS3. Independently of whether they are developed at regional or national level, the RIS3 are to be understood as a tool for structural change. Designing RIS3 implies a governance mechanism that involves intensively all appropriate levels of stakeholders and decision makers: it should be an exercise that includes policy development by local, regional and national authorities with clearly defined roles and responsibilities and moreover a sound coordination among the levels. The national level of governments faces strong challenges related to coordination: coordination of related policies and coordination of RIS3 planning and multilevel governance. How to meet these challenges will vary, taking into account diverse governance structures and institutional set-up and capabilities in the different Member States.

Based on and building on the experiences from the peer-review workshops organised by the S3 Platform, we now launch a peer-review workshop where Member States will have the possibility to present their work on Research and Innovation strategies for smart specialisation and receive peer feedback from 'critical friends' from both national and regional authorities.

The event would allow participants to exchange views and experiences on coordination of RIS3 and related policies and national experiences on multi-level governance. The different national experiences will be shared and can be supported from other regional and national governments in order to find the best policy solutions for optimal design of RIS3 that supports a shift of perspective in planning and implementation of innovation.



Participation will be open for: (i) national responsible authorities (28) for RIS3 by direct invitation through the S3 Platform, and (ii) registered members of the S3 Platform. An appropriate balance of both national and regional peers will be ensured through management of registrations.
