

cuisine on cruise

Buffet Seating

There are usually two dinner timings available, one between 6:00p.m. – 6:30pm and second from 8:00pm. – 8:30pm, depending on your ship itinerary. The 6:00pm seating will allow you to work up an appetite and enjoy the mid-night buffet. Some ships have a 1:30a.m. Buffet where you can comfortably go for the late seating. Throughout the entire cruise your table is reserved with your waiter and your busboy will become like family, dedicated in making your cruise a dream vacation.

Table size is usually for 4, 6, 8 or 10 with the occasional table for two. If you are travelling in a group or with friends always ask for a large table

as you'll want to ensure that you're all seated collectively at the same dinner seating. A great way to meet new friends from around the world. Unless, of course, your stateroom has a balcony and your significant other wants a private dinner for two!

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
